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Multidisciplinary health and education and project in Myanmar



Faculty of Life and Health Sciences undertook to explore how high rates of maternal mortality in Myanmar might be alleviated through multi-disciplinary education and emergency obstetric support

Partnered with the **Business Schoo**l to investigate how the economic conditions of rural communities in conflict impacted Myanmar might be improved through enterprise activity.













Myanmar: socio-economic profile

Population 54.38m

Longest running civil war 1948, period of stability 2011-2021 Military coup in February 2021

DAC listed country with extreme poverty and limited infrastructure

Valuable natural resources

Ethnically diverse 163 ethnic groups

High maternal mortality rates, especially in remote ethnic areas – 250 maternal deaths for every 100,000 live births

Vulnerable to climate change



Political conflict

1948: Outbreak of civil war

2011-2020: Period of stability

Feb 2021: Military coup

Civil disobedience movement (CDM)



BABs Aim and Objectives

Aim: to identify and implement a contextually designed, community-based educational meta-intervention to impact risk factors associated with maternal mortality in remote communities of Myanmar.

Core Objectives:

- Analyse contextual factors influencing education and maternal health within ethnic groups in remote areas
- Co-design and evaluate innovative, culturally relevant educational initiatives to address development challenges
- Identify common and unique components and implement into the design of four work package toolkits





Project plan

3-year research project exploring contextual and cultural factors related to maternal health

Three regions of Myanmar – Karen State, Kachin State and Shan State

Research - includes mapping, needs assessments, surveys, focus groups and community consultation to explore risk factors and barriers. Integration of unique cultural and contextual factors into three educational work packages

Work package:

2. Maternal health education programme for remote areas

2. Emergency obstetric care education programme

4. Entrepreneurship development and capacity building education programme



Birth across the Borders – Data Collection

Work Package 2

- Qualitative Interviews / FGs N=139
- CMIC Quantitative Survey N=1,589

Work Package 3

- Qualitative Interviews / FGs N=61
- EmOC Quantitative Survey N=38

Work Package 4

- Qualitative Interviews / FGs N=73
- SocEnt Quantitative Survey N=950



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


Integrated Curriculum Design Framework (ICDF)
